



Urban renewal for a residential area

(Le Bouscat, France)

This new district is built around two major axes, called Small Metropolitan Spaces. As central and main spaces, they allow both traffic and meetings, forming a real active square and offering many uses: terraces, relaxation and comfort areas, work and play areas. A network of green alleys serves the buildings and connects them to the EMP. Pedestrian traffic is easy, on the scale of the garden. The
